Ripley Town Council is excited to bring several community events to you this year, starting with our annual Ripley Spring Market next month.



New play tower at Porterhouse Road

Ripley Town Council are responsible for two play areas in the Ripley Township; Cedar Avenue (near Ripley Leisure Centre) and Porterhouse Road, both in Ripley.

In 2021, we upgraded Cedar Avenue play area and this year, we are doing the same for Porterhouse Road.



We have been fortunate to have received a grant for £10,000 from the National Lottery to put towards the new equipment. This play area is used by many young people in the local area and pupils at Ripley St. John's School, around the corner on Dannah Street.

Pictured below is the new piece of play equipment we will be installing. It has two different sized slides, and three climbing areas, including a fire pole - ideal for children from aged 2 upwards. We will also be putting a bench in the area for grownups to rest on whilst the kids play!

We hope to have the equipment in place for the start of the school summer holidays.



Warm Wednesday round-up

Ripley Town Council were quick to react to the cost-of-living crisis last winter by providing a warm space each Wednesday at Greenwich Community Sports Hub on Nottingham Road in the town.

The sessions finished at the end of March. They have been attended each week by around 45 people. They were welcomed by our wonderful team of volunteers, who served them free hot drinks. A delicious, free hot lunch was provided and enjoyed by everyone.

Attendees made new friends, played cards and bingo and joined in with crafts. One week, BBC Radio Derby attended with poetry and musical entertainment and chair-based exercises for our guests to join in with. We also invited organisations to come along to give out information, such as Derbyshire Fire and Rescue, the Ripley SNT team, Derbyshire Carers and Citizen's Advice.

We were fortunate to receive funding towards Warm Wednesdays from; Derbyshire County Council, Foundation Derbyshire and Amber Valley CVS.

Ripley Town Council intend to hold Warm Wednesdays in late autumn, depending on funding.

Ripley Police team location update

In our last newsletter, we reported that Ripley Town Council had written to the Police and Crime Commissioner and the Chief Constable of Derbyshire Police, asking them to reconsider closing the office which the Ripley Safer Neighbourhood Team (SNT) occupied in Ripley Town Hall.

We have some good news to share with you. Ripley Town Council offered desk space for members of the Ripley SNT at our Grosvenor Road based office, and they have accepted our invitation.

This will enable the Ripley SNT team to have somewhere in the town centre to carry out administrative tasks and respond to incidents in the town in a more efficient manner.

Councillor Steve Freeborn said, 'We approached the Divisional Command Team, offering a desk space in the Ripley Town Council office, so that the Ripley SNT have a visibility to the general public and will be openly available for members of the public to drop in.

There will still be a reduction in policing services in Ripley Town Centre as the Ripley SNT will be mainly based at Wyatts Way, at the Police Headquarters, but this is step in the right direction for the good of our community and local businesses'.

Don't forget to vote in the May elections

On **Thursday 4th May 2023**, local elections are taking place in Amber Valley and across a further 229 councils in England.

From this year, you will need to bring photo ID to be able to vote at a polling station. A wide range of photo ID will be accepted, including passports, driving licences and cards with a PASS Mark (proof of age).

If you don't have an accepted form of photo ID, you can apply for a free voter ID document known as a Voter Authority Certificate.

Environmental Matters

Ripley Town Council is committed to the whole of the township becoming cleaner and greener with an overall ambition of having a zero-carbon footprint.

We are seeking a high quality built and natural environment for the benefit of all and recognise the need to use our powers and influence to protect and improve the environment, climate and biodiversity.

We recognise that the day-to-day operations can impact both directly and indirectly on the environment, climate and biodiversity. We aim to protect and improve these through good management and by adopting best practice wherever possible.

One relatively easy and cost effective way to protect the environment and encourage biodiversity is through rewilding.

"Rewilding is about working with nature, to get natural processes, the foundations of life, working again"

Rewilding is about letting nature take care of itself, enabling natural processes to shape land, repair damaged ecosystems and restore degraded landscapes. Through rewilding, wildlife's natural rhythms create wilder, more biodiverse habitats.



We would like to look into rewilding part of the land down by the pond at Greenwich Community Sports Hub on Nottingham Road in Ripley, in consultation with the clubs that play there, members of the public who walk in the area and local environmental groups. This would mean setting aside a large area for nature so that nature can truly evolve on its own terms, maximising biodiversity, carbon storage and essential eco benefits. We would no longer cut all the grass in this area, therefore enabling this process to happen.

You can do this at home

Create a wildlife-friendly garden that helps wildlife move through it, to help nature on a smaller scale.
