This is Heage resident, Cllr Lobley's second time as Mayor of Ripley, having conducted the role in 2018-2019. He will be accompanied to engagements with his Consort, Mrs. Janette Lobley.

Cllr Lobley will be supporting Amber Valley CVS Befriending scheme during his term as Mayor.

One of his priorities is to visit Ripley Town Centre businesses over the coming months, to introduce himself and inform them about how Ripley Town Council would like to work with them through the Ripley Town Centre Traders Forum to hear their aspirations for their business and Ripley Town Centre.

Before going any further, I would like to put on record a heartfelt thanks to those former members of the Council for their service to the community of the Ripley Township and a warm welcome to the new Councillors.



For my own part, I was honoured to take up the role of Town Mayor from Councillor Nigel Weaving (pictured opposite) at the Council's Annual meeting. He had done a sterling job over the last 12 months. I was also very pleased to be able to pass on my Deputy Mayor's badge to Councillor Lyndsay Cox.

On the Sunday immediately after being made Mayor, I opened the Town's annual Spring Market on Ripley Market Place. It was very well attended as usual, and I was given the chance to try out a set of the local Safer Neighbourhood Team's "bracelets" to go with my chain.



At the end of May, I had the pleasure of presenting two children (one pictured below) and one adult a Good Citizen Award for their role in spotting a potential fire in Nether Heage. Their quick action prevented a major incident.



In early June, I welcomed a huge crowd of people to the Town's Open Air Cinema showing of Encanto on a very sunny Crossley Park (see the photo on the front of this newsletter). It had been delayed by a couple of years because of the pandemic, but I am sure that it was enjoyed by everyone who attended.



A few days later, my consort and I went to the Nether Heage yard sale. This event allowed local residents to put their surplus items on sale and gave visitors and residents the chance to walk round the village looking for bargains, meet old friends and make new ones.

New play equipment at Porterhouse Road play area

Watch your speed!

Thanks to funding from the Derbyshire Police and Crime Commissioner, Ripley Town Council are now able to install Speed Indicator Devices (SIDs) at various locations throughout the township.

SIDs accurately measure the oncoming vehicles speed and displays this value to the driver. Please take care whilst driving and keep to the speed limit!





Ripley mourns young resident, Captain Kori

As you may recall, we had a very special member of our community called Kori switch the Ripley Christmas Lights on last year. We are saddened to report that 11-year-old Kori, passed away on 9 July at home in Ripley, with his family with him.



Kori was born with hypoplastic left heart syndrome.

Our thoughts are with his amazing family, friends and staff at Ripley St. John's School which Kori attended at this sad time.

After his second heart transplant, he became unwell and towards the end of last year, Kori started receiving palliative care. With his family fearing that Christmas 2022 would be his last, Ripley Town Council invited him to switch on our Christmas lights.

We want to help keep Kori's memory alive and continue his plight to raise awareness of the importance of organ donation.

We urge those of you who watch YouTube, to subscribe to his YouTube channel and watch the videos that Kori made with his family - just search for 'Kraken the Box'. Kori's story of his heart transplant journey spread worldwide with the help of American film star, Johnny Depp. Kori was a huge fan of The Pirates of the Caribbean film series in which Mr. Depp starred as Captain Jack Sparrow, which also started Kori's obsession with pirates!

The Make-A-Wish Foundation arranged for Mr. Depp to video call Kori back in December 2022. He also recorded a special message to Kori, as Captain Jack, which can be seen on YouTube.

Kori has many fans, not only in our community but across the world who will miss him.

What is your carbon footprint?

A carbon footprint is the total amount of greenhouse gases (including carbon dioxide and methane) that are generated by our actions.

How can we reduce our carbon footprint?



- Eat locally grown products
- · Limit meat consumption, especially beef
- · Eat fish which has been sustainably fished
- · Avoid buying products with excessive plastic packaging
- · Save yourself some money instead of buying plastic carrier bags, just remember to reuse the ones you already have when you go shopping.

TRANSPORT

- Leave your car at home and walk, cycle or use public transport
- If you have to use your car, be smart about when and how you drive
- Use an electric or hybrid car (there are charging points in the Shirley Road Car Park and Sainsburys in Ripley).



CLOTHING

- Take good care of your clothes and shoes
- Try swapping, borrowing, renting or buying second-hand clothes
 Buy responsibly-made clothing





ENERGY AND WASTE

- Reduce your time in the shower
- Turn down your heating by 1 degree and it may cut your heating bill by 10%
- Turn the tap off whilst you brush your teeth or wash the pots
- Recycle as much food and packaging waste as you can
- Use energy efficient lightbulbs
- · Insulate your home well and use draught excluders
