# **Our priorities**

A new year is the perfect opportunity to plan for the future. A municipal (civic council) year runs from the beginning of May to the end of April.

Ripley Town Council has been looking at the needs of our community and what we can do to make the Ripley Township a better place to live in and enjoy.

At our meeting in November 2023, Ripley Town Council committed to investigating the possibility of the following new projects in the township over the coming years:

Consider purchasing woodland for the community to use.

Work in partnership with Amber Valley Borough Council to provide a youth facility in Nether Heage.

Replace the worn-out skate park at Greenwich Community Sports Hub on Nottingham Road in Ripley.

Work with Ripley Town Football Club and the Football Association to build a 3G pitch at Greenwich Community Sports Hub.

Be more involved with Butterley Ironworks Trust in the restoration of the former Butterley Engineering site.

Develop a relationship with the Derwent Connections Scheme, generating electricity from the River Derwent for Heage and Ambergate.

# **DEFIBRILLATORS:**

# Do you know where your nearest one is?



Defibrillators are used to revive someone from sudden cardiac arrest. They are normally located in workplaces and public spaces like airports, shopping centres, community centres, and train stations. These defibrillators are known as public access defibrillators (PADs) as anyone can use them. The defibrillator or the case it sits in may say 'AED' or 'defibrillator'.

If you need a defibrillator in an emergency, the 999 emergency operator may be able to tell you where one is, so you can ask someone to get it. By performing CPR and using a defibrillator, you'll give someone the best possible chance of survival.

# Ripley Music Festival URGENTLY NEED YOUR HELP!

Ripley Music Festival is a registered charity and events are organised by local volunteers. It supports the local music scene and brings a week long festival to the Ripley area each summer.

Without an injection of funds, it is very likely that the Festival will have to be cancelled this year. RMF have reported that the finances are not so good, mainly because of the cost of living crisis.

Cash is needed to ensure the Festival can go ahead with the free outdoor events in Crossley Park. It costs at least £12,000 to stage the event and whilst two thirds of that is funded by Ripley Town Council and regional charities, RMF's organisers have stated that additional donations are needed urgently to bridge the £4,000 funding gap.
